# TYPE OF HORSE TRAILERS.

Here are some horse trailers:

- 2 horse strait (like I have)= It would be best if you teach your horse how to self load if you have a 2 strait horse trailer, for safety and for conveyuns.
- 2 horse slant.= You can lead you horse in or you can also self load but it doesn't matter as much in the slant horse trailers.
- 3 horse slant.= Same thing just more horse space...
- 4-5 horse slant. Same as 3... And 2...
- And some people just use a live stock trailer witch is perfectly fine!= It is just like a slant. But not as fancy!

Most horse trailers have windows attached to then that you can pull down or up... Especially the ones with no built in open windows like live stock looking ones...

Well that's some horse trailers.



# WHY HORSES ARE SCARED OR NOT WILLING TO GET IN A HORSE TRAILER.

# HOW TO TRAIN YOUR HORSE TO SELF LOAD AND WHAT TO DO IN THAT SITUATION
